Your delegates from Palomar District Federation were President Nancy B Jones, 1st VP-Dean Bev York, 2nd VP-Membership-incoming President Sherry Lutes, Social Media Chair Sonja Hults, and District Past President/Poway member Barbara Lerma. Thank you for helping cover the expenses of your three officers for hotel rooms, flights to and from San Jose, registration, and meals. We were proud to represent you all!

GFWC 2nd Vice President Jolie Frankfurth spoke in two workshops and as our keynote speaker; her calm and friendly speaking style and her poignant pointers were such an inspiration! She encouraged clubs to have a strategic plan - create a vision together of where you would like your club to go in your community work. "We have power to make things happen!" Leaders need to talk, but also to "walk the walk" along with members to accomplish goals. Adopt an attitude of excitement. Help members cross the line into leadership. **CFWC Area Vice-Presidents:** If you remember the discussion at our Palomar Convention in April about the possible elimination of the CFWC Area Vice-Presidents ... Our District did not reach a resolution or make a recommendation for how to vote. At the CFWC Convention, after discussion and sharing of the benefits of the Area VP's, we were very relieved when the amendment was not approved. We are happy to report that those offices will continue beyond the 2024-2026 administration. We will continue to have the insights from these seasoned members to help keep our very large state with 10,000 plus members and 18 Districts connected and working together.

**Chairmen's Fair:** CFWC Chairmen staffed tables to provide inspiration and information about their program and advancement areas. Bev York collected their information. I was happy to pick up information about "Why Send out Press Releases?" from Communications/Branding Chair Chris Herzog.

Narratives Awards: The afternoon session was electric with excitement - and hearing "Palomar District" four times was such a treat! Our small District (under 400 members for 2023) won awards for Arts & Culture, Civic Engagement & Outreach, and Leadership and to top off the excitement, Palomar District won the chimes for Area D for the largest percentage of membership growth.

Your clubs' efforts paid off with 16% membership growth, including the delayed membership dues from July. So our dismay in July from those delayed dues turned into a great advantage for membership growth through December 31st. Congratulations, Palomar District Federation, for "Growing and Grinning!" with your sister clubs! Hearty Congratulations to Bonsall Woman's Club - they received awards for Club Creativity for Arts & Culture, and for Communications & Public Relations!

**Your President's Two-Minute Speech:** This was my last chance to impress and make an impact as District President so I shared how successful our clubs' fundraisers and events were during this year. Then, I shared the success of our Affiliates for Children project. Over these two years, we used different modes of presentation and received lots of support from our clubs and members! We collected \$4,956 for six GFWC Affiliates over two years - we learned and donated, and we thank you all very much!

I am honored and humbled to receive this award. After serving 7 years in the Navy as a medic, I began my academic journey as a civilian majoring in chemistry. Through life's turns, I had to put a pause on my studies and follow my husband, who still serves, to Japan. While living overseas, I had hoped to start a family, but once again, life had other plans.

After one year of trying for a baby, I began working as a bus attendant with elementary age school children to help support our fertility treatments. As a split shift worker, I would pick up the children from home at the beginning of the day and drop them off in the afternoon.

They would share everything with me. Even things that I'm sure would embarrass their parents. During my breaks, I would go to my fertility appointments, I never missed a shift except for the morning of my embryo transfer and the morning of my subsequent miscarriage.

Even on the hardest days, the children were a beam of light that reminded me of hope. Honestly, what surprised me the most was how much I would enjoy working with kids. I absolutely fell in love with being a positive and safe adult in their daily routine. Asking what they ate for lunch and talking to them about anything and everything was a tremendous blessing that I will always cherish. This was my first glimpse at learning through play and has continued to be the motto I live by. The times I shined the brightest were when they would ask homework questions, especially science and math related problems. I vividly remember the days they asked about the water cycle or how lightning interacted with vehicles. This is how I discovered my true purpose, which is cultivating the best environments for children to grow to their full potential. My efforts towards working in education began there, and I have been working ever since to make it a reality.

After the surprise conception of my now one year old son and the move back to the United States, it has been transition after transition, but I am grateful to be back in school. It has not been easy, but I know it is worth it.

Beginning Fall 2025, I will be transferring from MiraCosta College to a bachelor's program through Arizona State University. My goal is to begin teaching in the kindergarten class but continue to pursue higher education for a master's and on to a doctorate. Later on in my career, I would love to teach high school chemistry to inspire others, just like my science teachers inspired me.

I am immensely grateful to the Palomar District Federation, California Federation of Women's Clubs for selecting me for the Hazel Erickson Teaching Scholarship. Thank you so very much for this opportunity.
