We have had a couple of great events these past several weeks.

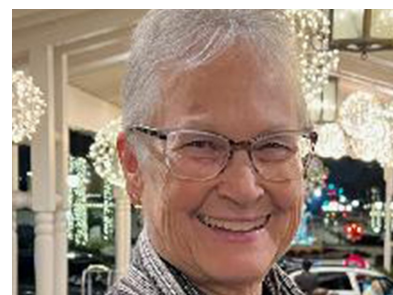

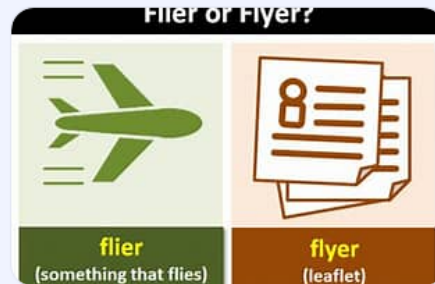

## GFWC Women's History Resource Center— Carolyné “Doc” Hensel, Chairman

A unique feature of 1734 N Street is the long, narrow room above the former carriageway (now the entrance to the Iron Gate Inn Restaurant ), constructed in 1884 by owners Thaddeus and Augusta Markley. Having purchased a portion of



the adjoining lot to create a grand driveway and admit more light into their home, the Markleys were dismayed to discover that plans for neighboring 1728 included windows overlooking their property. They constructed a wall to protect their privacy, but city building regulations limited its height; undeterred, they built an extension from the second floor, creating a space 12 ½ feet wide by 65 feet long that neighbors dubbed the “spite room.”

## Advocates for Children—Nancy B Jones, Chairman

### Magic Yarn Project

Yes, it WAS magical!

How can we cheer up kids who are ill and have lost their hair - due to chemotherapy, alopecia, burns or other illnesses? At our September Palomar District Board meeting, President Sherry Lutes introduced the Magic Yarn Project, which is a non-profit that provides "Homespun wigs for little cancer fighters." This organization guides the creation of "whimsical, giggle-inducing character wigs and beanies that invite children into the world of imagination and play during difficult times." In October, Judy, Cindi, and Nancy B from our club joined in with President Sherry and other District members to contribute to the yarn-wrapping portion of the project. The donated skeins of specified soft yarn for the wigs are in the colors for Elsa, Ariel, Moana, Rapunzel, Wonder Woman, and even Captain Jack Sparrow, which is a favorite for the boys.

We got to work unwinding each full skein of yarn into a particular length on a yarn wrapping board with dowels - just right for making Captain Jack's or another character's hair! Standing, swiping around the dowels - we were chatting and laughing the whole time and trading places when it was time to sit for a while. What a fun project! Then we tied, cut, twisted, and saved the yarn lengths in bags or in plastic, ready to use in the next phase of the project.

The next Magic Yarn Project session was held on May 3, with six Palomar District members working. President Sherry; Patty and Suzanne from Bonsall WC; and Judy, Cindi and Nancy B from WC Vista joined in - in a large gym that held at least a dozen tables each seating eight people. We crocheted and tied the pre-cut lengths into pre-made beanies to make the soft, comfortable, and fun wigs for kids with medical hair loss. We created wigs for Ariel and Moana, chatting away and sharing about our Woman's Club while Disney music played in the background. The kids' smiles will say Thank You! This project provides the completed wig/beanies free for the families. The wig requests are filled and sent out to kids all over the world. Donations of money, beanies, and specified yarn are welcomed. We had a great time creating these magical wigs for the kids in their difficult times. 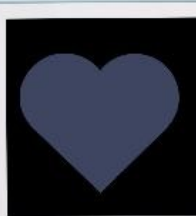
