### 3rd VP-Programs & Itineraries—Pam Hermansader

We're delighted to welcome David Lewis as our featured speaker for the September meeting. Below is a brief biography highlighting his background and contributions. Looking forward to seeing you in Julian—Come ready to be inspired and engaged!



David Lewis  
Guest speaker

David Lewis is a fourth-generation Julian resident whose family first settled here in 1887. He and his wife are proud parents of two daughters, and his deep roots in this town are matched only by his commitment to honoring its legacy.

David began researching Julian's history in 1999 through his work at the Julian Cemetery. Since then, he has devoted over 9,000 hours to uncovering and documenting our region's stories—culminating in the publication of his book *Last Known Address*. He volunteers with the Julian Pioneer Museum, the Julian Historical Society, and the Julian Cemetery, and has surveyed and mapped the Julian, Banner, and Casner Cemeteries.

His contributions extend beyond Julian: he's assisted SDSU's archaeological teams at the Whaley House and the Nate Harrison site on Palomar Mountain. But perhaps most notably, David has brought long-overdue attention to Julian's African American history. He rediscovered the lost locations of African American graves, co-founded the Julian Black History Committee, launched the town's first Black History celebration, wrote *The Robinson Play*, and recently published *African American Pioneers of Julian*.

David also stewards the B. F. Miller Heritage Orchard Conservancy, where he cultivates apple varieties grown in Julian between 1870 and 1910—preserving agricultural history with the same care he brings to his research.

I know you have all been busy recruiting new members. We are now a medium-sized District with 417 members and the current numbers for your clubs are as follows: Bonsall 74, Fallbrook 62, Inland Valley 10, Julian 35, Poway 12, Vista 63, Valley Center 3, Carlsbad 134, Oceanside 24 as of July 31.

What do you do next? How do you RETAIN those members?

Remember when you first joined how many years ago, how did the club officers and members treat you? Apparently, it was a very good experience since you are still with us! Have an orientation program to provide your new members with the information they need about your club; don't forget to give them an overview of District, CFWC, and GFWC.

Following their first meeting, give your new members a call to find out if they have any questions, and a short "getting to know you" chat can go a long way in encouraging your member share how nice they were treated with their friends.

A few reminders – Pair your new members with a seasoned buddy for each of them to answer their questions and give them guidance about your club. Inquire about their interest. Is it education, arts, reading, crafts, community issues? Introduce them to the chairman of that project and get them on the committee; or, would they like to learn about something new? Invite them to a District meeting or Area D Conference since these meetings are close by. Suggest carpooling.

How do you keep your existing members? Say Thank You, feature a member or two in your newsletter, pointing out their contributions to the club, or send a note letting them know that they are appreciated, acknowledge them at your meetings, ask for their opinion, and be responsive. Share the projects and encourage members to volunteer--many hands make less work. Most of all, make sure you take time to have fun and make friends!



## GFWC Women's History Resource Center— Carolyné "Doc" Hensel, Chairman

The WHRC collections encompass GFWC's institutional archives, including convention records, files related to our programs and leadership, and "Clubwoman" magazine (and its predecessors). We hold a robust photograph and audio-visual collection, as well as GFWC ephemera, memorabilia, and the art and artifacts that furnish our historic Headquarters building. We also maintain a reference library collection focused on women's history, the woman's club movement, and the history of volunteerism. Please note: While we do have many state- and club-level archival and photographic materials, we do not maintain official records for State Federations or local clubs, or for outside organizations.





The rest of the weekend was Pirates, workshops and speakers. We are inspired and guided as we grow into our roles and we attend because it is important.




